## Business Continuity & Archives

**Q: Where can I store Local Chapter records to ensure new officers can get documentation after our elections?**

A: Use the free PTWW cloud repository that is securely partitioned for privacy of 2-3 chapter contacts to load and access rosters and financial records. For access and training, contact the [ptwwwebtigers@gmail.com](mailto:ptwwwebtigers@gmail.com)

PTWW hosts a free WordPress website landing page for each chapter to ensure an online presence for visibility.

## Domains & Landing Pages

**Q: Do all Local Chapters need a domain to have a website?**

A: Nope. FYI, Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Number (ICANN) registers official domains for about \$37/year. Many Chapters have PTWW manage the ICANN fees with pass-through billing with Annual Dues, to ensure business continuity.

You can still have a free, simple PTWW-hosted website without a domain.

**Q: So if my chapter wants it's own website, what happens?**

A: No problem! Use whatever e-tool can be supported with hands-on volunteers and budget. A fully integrated, 1-stop CRM or CMS tool cover invites, members, emails, domain, and website, costing ~\$70/month. Invite/rsvp tools, MeetUp or Punchbowl, cost ~\$10/month.

Of course, using a generic (ghost) e-mail to protect privacy from Google Gmail, or MS Outlook is usually FREE! Using easy-to-learn tools familiar with your membership is the key to successful outreach.



# Regional Video Meetings



## 55+ Residents Recruiting by Charlotte NC Chapter

Ever ask how to find an untapped, new group of gay or bisexual men?

**Q: How did Charlotte Chapter start this outreach action?**

A: Two of our existing members moved into the specialized housing and discovered 10 other gay men already living in the 55+ age independent living, multi-building complex.

**Q: What happened with the paid social management team?**

A. WOW! Surprisingly they welcomed our Prime Timers group with open arms and worked to include us with some of their regularly scheduled activities. In fact, they are also helping CLT Prime Timers to plan other “open house” events with other independent living residences in metro Charlotte and Rock Hill SC.

**Q: Any suggestions how to get prepared for this targeted outreach?**

A: Knowing a current resident willing to be recognized as a Prime Timer sures makes it easy to recruit other men and encourage attending the introduction meeting. Having business flyers and cards to distribute at each facility demonstrates we are a relevant and viable social-focused group.

## Sharing Success Stories and New Ideas

PTWW hosts video meetings in April and October for all Chapter Presidents and up to four additional local leaders-per-chapter to talk about what activities are working well - or not.

NEW ways to reach out to untapped potential members and add a fun activity get SHARED! Here three highlights from the April Regional Meetings:

### Are You Recognizing New Members?

Sarasota FL and San Antonio TX shared how each chapter quickly speeds socializing for recent “newbies.”

**Q: What does Sarasota Chapter do that “works?”**

A: Sarasota has a breakfast every few months inviting every man that joined us since the previous meeting. SPT pays for all new members and officers attending, however spouses may their own way. We then talk about chapter operations and activities.

**Q: What “works” for the San Antonio Chapter?**

A: San Antonio has a quarterly potluck for only new members to meet other new members. An officer or two presents basic “how to” info for RSVPs, reviews the upcoming activities, and business info.

## CAN-SPAM / CASL Controlling the Assault of Non-Solicited Pornography and Marketing Act of 2003

PTWW is complying with US and Canada legislation empowering individuals to UNSUBSCRIBE or to OPT IN from “bulk email.”

### Q: How does this impact PTWW?

A: All official emails will have an UNSUBSCRIBE link at the bottom of the message. If the recipient clicks that link confirming he no longer want to receive future email, his email address will be deleted from PTWW Leadership Profiles.



### Q. Does this impact my chapter emails or weekly e-blasts?

A. Nope. When a man applies to be a Local Chapter member, it is implied he is consenting to be contacted at that email inbox.

If he OPTS OUT of receiving chapter mailings or listing in rosters choice must be noted on each membership application.

**On Feb. 1, 2024**, both Google and Yahoo started enforcing new bulk email requirements for senders on three areas:

**authentication of outgoing emails**

**reported spam rates**

**ability to easily unsubscribe from email lists**


All messages sent from the same primary domain umbrella count toward the 5,000 limit and may be tagged as SPAM by incoming filters Google or Yahoo!

**Always check your SPAM folder once a week!**


